Welcome to your ARTISTIC ADVENTURE!

Our Goal is to provide you with superior, creative opportunities AND fun!! (Yeah, we are SERIOUS!)

DAY CAMP tuition includes all classes, recreational activities, supervision, workshops, entertainment, lunch and snacks daily.

INSURANCE & PHYSICAL: Campers must be covered by their own health insurance and are required to have a physical completed by a licensed physician within one year of camp date in order to be admitted to the program. A sports physical is sufficient. Failure to comply will result in the camper not being admitted to the program, in which case no refund of camp fees will be made. Upload enclosed Medical Forms one month before camp.

COVID-19 REGULATIONS: AWP is following CDC recommended guidelines while at camp. Campers and staff will take a rapid test upon arrival on day 1 (AWP will arrange for testing on campus. The test is FREE with most insurance. Families will be responsible for the cost, if not covered by their insurance) If the camper/staff member tests negative, they will be admitted to camp. If they test positive, they will not be allowed to attend camp and no refund of camp fees will be made. However, a credit balance, equal to ½ of the camp fee will be created to be used for any other AWP classes, workshops, camps and events within the next 18 months. Masks, temperature checks and regular hand washing and sanitizing are required while at camp.

MEDICATION: All medications, including “over-the-counter” medication, must be left with the Camp Staff. For the safety of all the campers, any medications found in the possession of a camper will be confiscated, parents will be notified, and dismissal from camp could result. “Over the counter” meds are available in the Camp Clinic and can be given by the Camp Staff if deemed necessary and permission has been granted by the parent.

CABARET: Campers have the option to perform for each other at Cabaret! It's an afternoon filled with entertainment and standing ovations! You are welcome to perform whatever you are best at ...dancing, singing, comedy, juggling, playing a musical instrument etc. You must PREPARE and sign up IN ADVANCE in your online registration OR at check-in the first day of camp. *NOTE: IN ORDER TO HAVE TIME FOR EVERYONE, performance pieces are limited to 2 minutes & YOU MAY ONLY PERFORM IN 1 PIECE PER SESSION! WE CANNOT ACCEPT ANY CABARET REQUESTS After CHECK-IN.

- Material needs to be appropriate for ALL ages
- Bring props, costumes, music as needed
- 2 minute time limit
- Accompaniment on an electronic device (labeled with performer name and title). I-phone, I-pad etc. Bring adapter.

PHONE CALLS TO & FROM CAMPERS: Phone calls tend to disrupt the camp program. For these reasons, PHONE CALLS & CELL PHONES ARE NOT PERMITTED IN CLASS. They may be left in the student's backpacks and turned off during Day Camp. You may reach the camp staff by leaving a message at (770) 998-8111 or on Lynn Stallings' cell phone, (770) 366-6888. We'll be busy creating a joyful, artistic experience for the campers, so please call ONLY if it's URGENT. Thank you.

WHAT TO BRING: Please check the schedule daily for any special items to bring the next day. The following items are needed daily:

- * Water bottle
- * Dancewear or sweats or comfortable clothes you can easily move in.
- * 3 balls or 3 bean bags or 3 chiffon scarves for juggling
- * Notebook, Pen or pencil
- * Any music, costumes or props for Cabaret!
- * Use a permanent marker to write the camper's name on every item.

ITEMS NOT TO BRING: Electronics (except for cabaret music), computers, clothing that promotes alcohol, tobacco or obscenities, printed material that may be considered objectionable, knives, weapons, matches, lighters, cigarettes or any item that could be of potential danger to yourself or others. The possession of these items could result in dismissal from camp. The camp cannot be responsible for lost items, although every effort would be made to find them. We suggest leaving valuables at home.

DRESS CODE: The Atlanta Workshop Players believe in expressing your artistic creativity in all that you do, including how you dress! We encourage you to wear bright colors, fun shoes, cool or silly hats and articles of clothing that express your individuality! When making these choices, we ask that you take into consideration a certain level of modesty. Please dress appropriately for all classes, shows and activities. Avoid clothing that is too sheer, extremely low cut, short-shorts or displays any suggestive phrases, designs, profanities, etc. Thanks.

REFUND POLICY: In case of cancellation, all fees, minus a \$100 cancellation fee, are refundable through April 15th. NO REFUNDS WILL BE MADE AFTER April 15th. All cancellations must be in writing. NO deduction is allowed for late arrival, early departure, withdrawal, or dismissal.

SUPERVISION: The success of your child's camp experience is directly related to the quality of our staff. The AWP Staff is instrumental in creating a joyful, family atmosphere. Many staff members have grown up with AWP, and most members return for many years. Counselors are chosen based on their love of children, leadership ability and expertise in the performing arts. Each counselor is carefully screened and participates in an intense counselor training program. They will work the closest with your child, providing students with an artistic adventure they will talk about for years to come! In fact, most of our counselors were campers with AWP 'once upon a time'! There will be 1 or 2 counselors for approximately 7 to 10 students. Administrative Staff works around the clock to make sure that your child's needs are met. They know that each student is special and will help make all of your requests a reality. The AWP staff is here to make your camp experience a fantabulous adventure!

DISCIPLINE: Camp is a place where young people can be free to have a good time in a well supervised, unregimented atmosphere and enjoy many creative activities with others. We do not expect any discipline problems. However, in the rare event that a camper might create a situation which disrupts the camp program or could be harmful to himself or the other students, parents will be notified to pick up that student immediately (In which case, the camp fee would be non-refundable). SMOKING, TOBACCO, ALCOHOL, PROFANITY, STEALING, THREATS, ACTS OF VIOLENCE, WEAPONS, ILLEGAL or UNRULY or DISRUPTIVE BEHAVIOR, SEXUAL CONTACT, AND ILLEGAL DRUG USE ARE STRICTLY FORBIDDEN AND WOULD WARRANT IMMEDIATE DISMISSAL FROM CAMP. A student's person and/or personal belongings (purse, book bag, etc.) may be searched if the AWP directors have reason to believe that the student is in possession of illegal, dangerous or unauthorized materials. Parents are responsible for any damages, or defacing of property incurred by students while at camp and will be billed for any damages, after camp.

DESCRIPTION OF MAJORS:

On Camera Majors (Video) prepare a “mini movie”. This could be a movie “trailer”, soap opera, commercial, music video, etc. Students & counselors “brainstorm” for story ideas and then collaborate with the video crew to bring the story to life. Videos are shown at the end-of-the-week show.

Musical Theatre Majors work with a musical director & choreographer to prepare a song and dance production number for performance during the end of the week show.
